

Geography

Geography will lead all our learning this term and the children will learn more about Plympton and their immediate local environment including Castle Green and Plympton Castle. They will spend time exploring our local area to find out about the physical and human features and will start to identify the main features of Plympton.

Science

Our Science focus this half term will be Plants. We will be planting different types of beans and exploring how they grow and this learning will be linked to Jack and the Beanstalk. The second half of the term we will be looking at Seasons and the changes that occur during the seasons. The children will look at how the seasons effect how things grown and also how the seasons happen at different times in different countries.

Art

This term art will focus on the French artist Henri Matisse. The children will explore Matisse's love of colour and painting with scissors to recreate his famous piece of art, 'The Snail'. The children will first create observational drawings of snails before using materials and different coloured paper to create their own snail.

PE

Our PE focus this term will be athletics and in particular throwing and jumping. The children will carry on to enhance the fundamental skills they learnt during the Spring Term and these skills will be transferred into team activities in preparation for Sports Day.

DT

In DT we will be designing and making moving pictures using different mechanisms including sliders, to make their pictures move. The children will be looking at different Traditional Tales and will be using them as inspiration to design and make their own purposeful and appealing moving picture.

RE

The focus for RE this term will be 'belonging'. The children will consider what they belong to and this will be linked to Christianity and Judaism. The children will consider how people from those faiths will show how they belong to their religion and the ceremonies they take part in to commit to their faith.

Computing

In computing this term we will be looking at the very important issue of internet safety. The children will develop a greater understanding of how to use the internet careful, considering the information they share. They will then create internet safety posters to tell other children how to stay safe on the internet.

SMSC

SMSC stands for spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. This term, the children will be learning all about key British values to help them understand what it means to 'be British'. We will be exploring democracy, civil law, respect and tolerance and liberty.
